Beginner Level

- Still developing confidence to complete wheelthrowing or handbuilding projects with minimal guidance
- Ideal for individuals with:
 - Little to no prior experience in clay
 - o A desire for a refresher on basic techniques
- Instructors assume no foundational knowledge
- Classes introduce essential skills to get started in ceramics

Intermediate Level

- Expected to consistently and independently demonstrate essential skills, including:
 - o Wedging clay effectively
 - o Centering clay on a potter's wheel
 - o Throwing and trimming basic forms with confidence
 - o Rolling slabs unaided
- · Constructing simple forms using pinching, slab, or coil techniques
- Should be able to apply glaze with familiarity and control
- Demonstrates a growing understanding of ceramic surface treatment

Advanced Level

- Possess technical and creative ability to develop a cohesive body of work
- Work may involve:
 - o Wheelthrowing methods
 - Sculptural handbuilding techniques
- Proficient in foundational techniques
- Push boundaries of:
 - o Form
 - o Function
 - Surface treatment
